FOLSOM PLAN AREA

The City of Folsom Plan Area sits on 3,250 acres bounded by Highway 50, White Rock Road, Prairie City Road, and the El Dorado County line. The community currently includes the neighborhoods of Broadstone Estates, Enclave at Folsom Ranch, Folsom Heights, Mangini Ranch, Russell Ranch, and White Rock Springs Ranch. Once complete in the next 25 to 30 years, the community will be home to 11,000 quality homes, five new elementary schools, a middle school, and a high school.

Building Services, Permits, and Inspections

Building Services reviews building permit plans for code compliance, issues permits for commercial and residential construction, conducts building inspections, and assists owners, designers, and contractors with building code questions and issues.

- ePermit Center: The ePermit Center provides information about the city's online permitting and plan review process.
- eTRAKiT: The city's online application portal, eTRAKiT, allows applicants to apply for plans, pay fees, check the status of permits or projects, view and print building permits or planning approval letters, and schedule inspections. The portal can be used for most minor building permits, including:
 - » Water heater changeouts
 - » HVAC replacements
 - » Re-roofing
 - » Minor remodeling projects
 - » Tree permits
 - » Grading permits
 - » Encroachment permits
 - » Transportation permits

ACCELERATED SMALL TENANT IMPROVEMENT REVIEW

The Folsom Accelerated Small Tenant Improvement Review (F.A.S.T.I.R.) process allows applicants to schedule one-hour appointments on Tuesday or Thursday mornings for eligible interior tenant improvements. BUSINESS LICENSE CERTIFICATES

The City of Folsom Municipal Code requires that all businesses operating within the city limits obtain a business license certificate. Folsom business certificates expire on June 30 every year. Renewal notices are mailed, with payment due by July 31. You can apply, renew, close, or search for a business license at folsom.hdlgov.com.

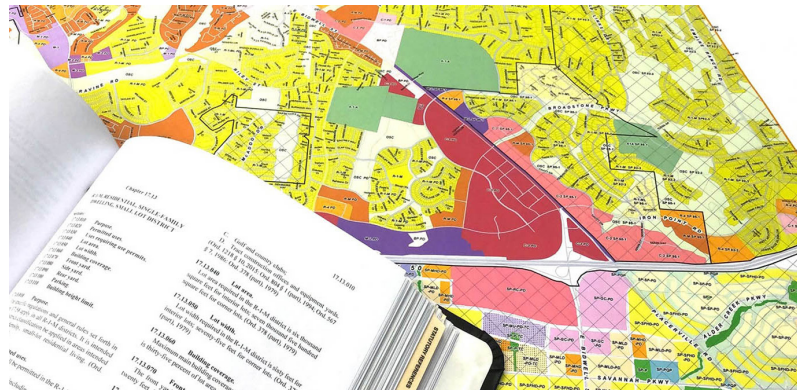

FOLSOM MUNICIPAL CODE

The City of Folsom Municipal Code is a compilation of ordinances and contains laws and regulations for the City of Folsom. The Municipal Code is organized by chapters, articles, divisions, and sections. It is a living document and is continually amended to better reflect the community needs. The Municipal Code is updated as new ordinances are adopted by the City Council. You can view the Folsom Municipal Code on the City of Folsom website or in the City Clerk's Office. FOLSOM ZONING CODE

As a part of the Folsom Municipal Code, the Zoning Code sets the rules for existing and new development in the city. It shapes the location, type, and design of buildings and land in Folsom. It also helps protect the environment and guard against potential use conflicts. It serves to promote and protect the safety, health, convenience, comfort, prosperity, and general welfare of residents and businesses.

The Zoning Code also sets land development requirements and establishes different uses within individual districts. Zoning regulations address the physical development of a site, including building height, lot requirements, setback from lot lines, parking requirements, sign types and sizes, and additional regulations.

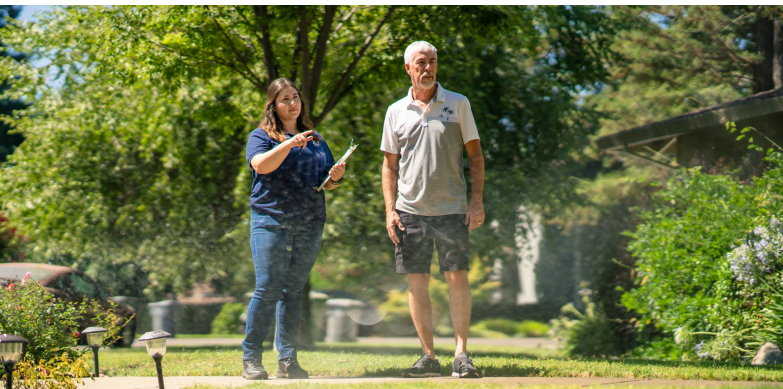

WASTE AND RECYCLING

Business Garbage and Recycling Requirements

Waste and recycling collection service provided by the City of Folsom is mandatory for all Folsom businesses. Organics service is also mandatory and may be provided by the City of Folsom or an authorized hauler.

All California businesses are required to separate recyclables (cans, bottles, cardboard), and organics (food scraps, food-soiled papers, yard trimmings) from landfilled trash. The city offers a variety of container sizes and collections days to fit your business needs.

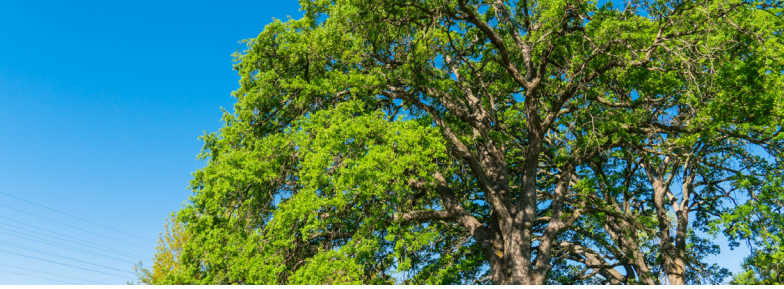

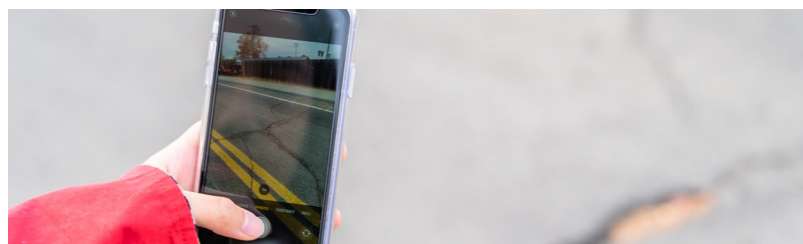

HOW TO REPORT AN INCIDENT

- SeeClickFix Folsom: Report non-emergency community issues with SeeClickFix Folsom. This free app improves your ability to submit and track non-emergency service requests through an online and mobile platform. Report issues such as:
 - » Abandoned Vehicles
 - » Code Enforcement Issues
 - » Grass or Weed Concerns
 - » Graffiti
 - » Illegal Dumping
 - » Litter or Debris
 - » Potholes
 - » Sidewalk Repair

- To report all non-emergency issues, such as crimes that previously occurred or traffic accidents with no injuries, call 916-461-6400, option 1.
- Report non-emergency storm-related hazards to the city, such as localized flooding, fallen trees or limbs, and clogged storm drains by calling 916-461-6722.
- Traffic signals or streetlights out and street signs down can be reported by calling 916-461-6702.
- If you notice a water leak or sewer spill anywhere in Folsom on residential, commercial, public, or private property, call 916-461-6177 during normal business hours (7 a.m. - 3:30 p.m.). For water emergencies after business hours, call 916-461-6400.

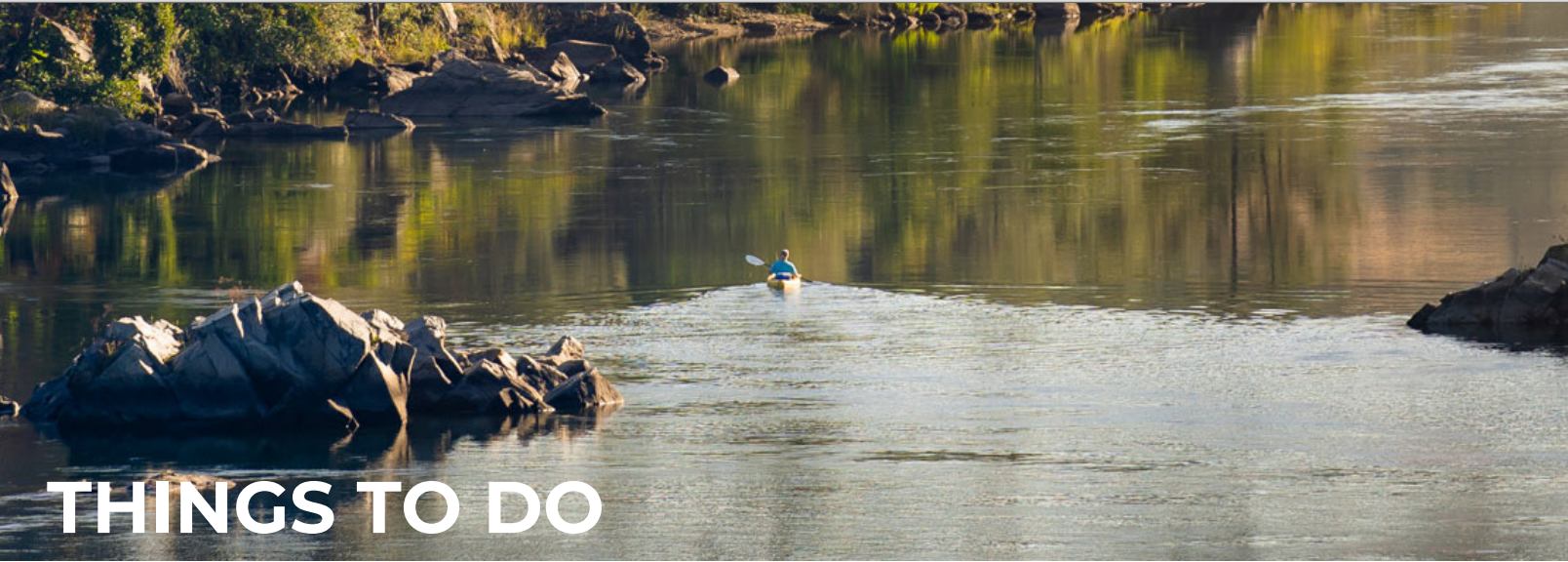

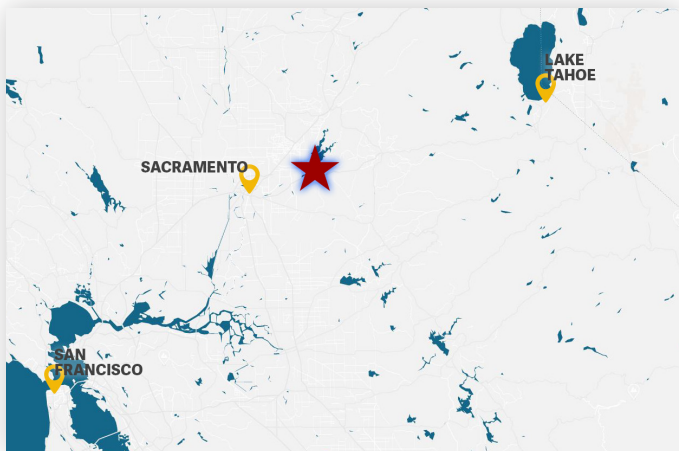


THINGS TO DO

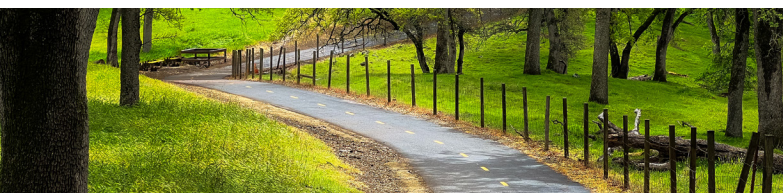

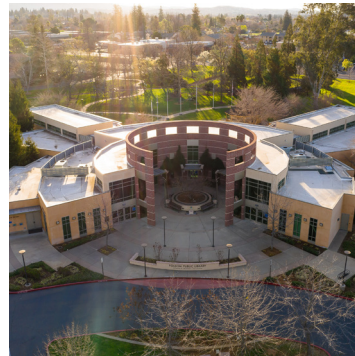

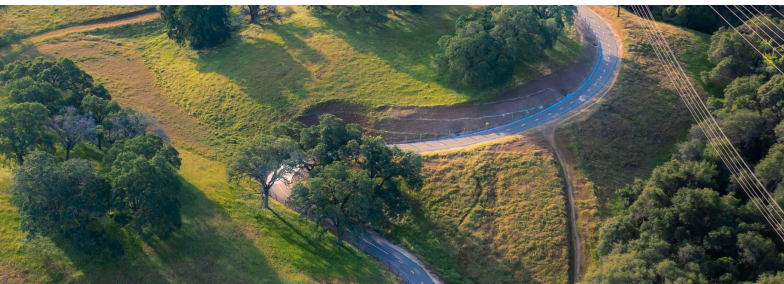
FOLSOM LAKE & LAKE NATOMA

Channel your competitive spirit with Folsom's fun runs and serious competitive events. The California International Marathon starts here and is a qualifying event for the Boston Marathon.



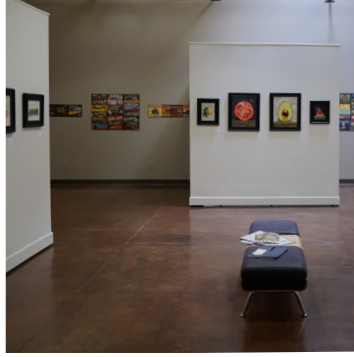
FISHING
