


# General Municipal Election




Items for the November 5, 2024 Election:

- Vote on a Citizens Initiative Special Tax Revenue Measure




### Citizens Initiative Special Tax Measure




- Proposed new sales tax rate = 1.0% (one percent)
  (one penny for every dollar)
- Local control = 100% of proceeds remain in Folsom
- Restricted proceeds can only be used for specific purposes identified in the tax measure
- Independent annual audit and citizen oversight

#### Citizens Initiative



- Police and Crime Reduction to maintain and improve police services and additional staffing, equipment, and facilities
- Fire, Rescue, and Emergency Medical Services to maintain and improve fire, rescue, and emergency medical services, equipment, and facilities
- Parks, Recreation Facilities and Trails to maintain and renovate existing parks, trails, and other recreation facilities and construct incomplete parks and trails
- Traffic Mitigation and Environmental Water Quality to improve traffic congestion and safety, street maintenance, storm water maintenance
- Community Enhancement and Economic Development to invest in job creation and enhance quality of life and long-term economic viability consistent with City-adopted master plans
- Major Capital Improvement Projects to fund major improvements to City infrastructure and facilities, including transportation/traffic safety, stormwater systems, parks and recreation facilities, public safety facilities, parking facilities, libraries and large capital equipment



# FOLSOM PUBLIC SAFETY AND ESSENTIAL CITY SERVICES MEASURE

Shall the measure to enact a 1 percent transaction and use tax (sales tax), providing approximately \$29 million annually until ended by voters, requiring local control, citizen oversight, independent annual audits, all funds staying in Folsom and the proceeds used only for the following: 20% - police services, 20% - fire protection, 15% - parks/trail improvement, 15% - traffic/street maintenance, 15% - community enhancement/economic development, and 15% - major capital improvement projects, be adopted?


## Ministerial Duty to Submit to Voters



Once qualified, the City Council has a ministerial duty to submit the initiative petition, without alteration, to the voters.
