

Campaign Signs / Enforcement Procedures

Time Allowed: September 6 - November 12

Campaign/election signs may not be erected earlier than sixty days before the election and must be removed within seven days after the election.

Placement on Private Property: Campaign/election signs may be located on private property, with the following conditions:

- **Residential Property:** One or more signs are permitted on private property with a maximum individual sign size of 10 square feet and a maximum height of 6 feet. Signs must be posted so that clear vision triangles or other lines of sight for pedestrians and vehicles are not impeded. (FMC 17.59.030(C)(13)(a))
- **Commercial Property:** One or more signs are permitted with a maximum individual sign size of 32 square feet and a maximum height of 10 feet. Signs must be posted so that clear vision triangles or other lines of sight for pedestrians and vehicles are not impeded. (FMC 17.59.030(C)(13)(b))
- Vehicle Signs: One or more signs are permitted inside a vehicle or painted on a vehicle, provided the sign does not obstruct view or other requirements in the California Vehicle Code. (FMC 17.59.030(C)(30)

Measurement of Sign Size: Sign size is the actual sign dimension. When both sides of the sign are printed upon, or when the sign is configured in a "v" or triangle shape, then such sign shall be counted as one sign and shall be allowed. (FMC 17.59.030(C)(13)(d))

Sign Prohibitions

- Signs must not be within or over a public right-of-way;
- Signs must not be over the roofline of any building; and
- Signs must not be within any clear vision triangle (for vehicle and pedestrian safety).
- Signs are Prohibited on public property
- Signs must not be placed within the public right-of-way or on State Park lands.

Enforcement of campaign sign regulations is generally conducted on a complaint-driven basis. This means that Code Enforcement Officers will not typically go out looking for violators, but rather respond to complaints about specific signs. **Exception:** If Code Enforcement Officers observe a sign that creates a safety issue (such as compromising vision at an intersection), they will proactively remove that sign for the safety of the public.

How to Report an Improper Sign:

Improper signs can be reported to Code Enforcement by telephone at (916)461-6227; by email at ppiccardo@folsom.ca.us or through SeeClickFix as a "sign violation".

When An Improper Sign is Reported:

- 1. Code Enforcement Officers will investigate to determine sign compliance.
- 2. If the sign is compliant, no action will be taken.
- 3. If the sign is in violation, the following steps will be taken:
 - a. Code Enforcement will contact candidate to advise:
 - i. Nature of the violation and what corrective action is needed;
 - ii. That there is a 24-hour window to correct before sign is removed
- 4. If corrective action is taken, no further Code Enforcement action is necessary.
- 5. If corrective action is not taken Code Enforcement will remove the sign and store it at the City's corporation yard. A list of removed signs will be kept by Code Enforcement for evidentiary purposes.
 - a. Candidates may contact Code Enforcement at (916)461-6227 to make arrangements to retrieve sign(s) from the Corp Yard
 - b. Signs that are not retrieved from the Corp Yard by November 19, 2024 will be discarded.

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
