## Item 6 – Resolution No. 11232



A Resolution of the City Council of the City of Folsom Approving and Confirming the Report of Delinquent Utilities Charges and Requesting Sacramento County to Collect Such Charges on the Tax Roll

- The City provides various utility services to 27,000 properties throughout Folsom
- Revenue Division bills and collects 54 million dollars in municipal utility charges annually
- Per California Code and Folsom Municipal code, we are able to transfer delinquent utility charges to the Tax Roll
  - Cal Gov't Code 25831, 38790.1
  - Cal Cal. Health and Safety Code §§ 5470 et seq
  - Cal. Health & Safety Code § 5473
  - Folsom Municipal Code Chapters 3.20 and 13.12
- Notices are sent in June for accounts more than 60 days past due, \$150 delinquent or greater
- Deadline to send the file to the County is August 2<sup>nd</sup>
- Staff recommends that Council adopt resolution 11232

## Item 7 – Resolution No. 11233



Resolution No. 11233 – A Resolution Amending Resolution No. 11172 and Approving the Updated City Impact and Connection Fee Schedule for Law Enforcement, Fire Suppression, General Facilities, Vehicles and Equipment, Park Improvement, Humbug-Willow Creek, Housing Trust, Water, Sanitary Sewer, Solid Waste, Transportation Improvement, Drainage, and Light Rail Impact Fees

- In May 2006, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 7812 which established new city impact and connection fees and adopted an annual inflationary adjustment
- The inflationary adjustment is from the Engineering News Record Construction Cost Index for January through December 2023
- The 2023 CCI is 2.70%
- Fees will be effective September 21, 2024
- Staff recommends that Council adopt resolution 11233

## Item 8 – Resolution No. 11235



Resolution No. 11235 – A Resolution Amending Resolution No. 11219 and Enacting the Annual Inflationary Adjustment for City User Fees for Planning

- In May 2006, the Folsom City Council adopted Resolution No. 7815 which established a new user fee schedule for selected city services and adopted an annual inflationary adjustment
- The annual inflationary adjustment is from the US Bureau of Labor Statistics & CA Department of Finance CPI-West Urban Consumers, San Francisco CMSA, annual amount as of December of the previous calendar year
- The 2023 CPI is 2.62%
- Fees will be effective September 21, 2024
- Staff recommends that Council adopt resolution 11235
