# STAGE 3 Reopening

Sacramento County amended its
Public Health Order June 12 to allow
additional businesses and activities to
reopen, with modifications to provide
for social distancing and health
and safety protocols. The Order is
consistent with the direction of the
State of California, to move further
into Stage 3 of the state's Resilience
Roadmap. The Health Order
supersedes previous orders and is in
effect until it is rescinded or amended
by the county health officer. Learn

## RECREATIONAL AMENITIES AND ACTIVITIES

The City of Folsom Parks & Recreation Department will begin to reopen some additional facilities and activities this summer, following the guidance of the Order and other industry-specific public health guidelines.

- The Steve Miklos Aquatic
   Center is now open for
   scheduled morning and evening
   lap swim. Please note that the
   play pools and play structures
   are closed at this time due to
   a planned renovation.
- Water features at Livermore, Kemp, and Nisenan parks will open by early July.
- The Folsom City Zoo Sanctuary will reopen Friday, July 17. New temporary hours of operation will be 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. Advance online ticket purchase is required for all guests.
- The popular Junior and Senior Zookeeper Summer Camps will be offered later this summer.
- The Andy Morin Sports Complex is open 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday for table tennis, batting cages, pickleball, and 2x2 volleyball. Face coverings are required at all times inside the complex.
- The Folsom Skate and Bike Park at Cummings Family Park is open from 1 to 7 p.m. daily.

- Park playgrounds, play
  equipment, tennis, bocce ball,
  pickleball, outdoor volleyball
  courts, and ball walls are open.
   Park athletic fields are open for
  non-contact sports or recreational
  activities. No structured or
  organized practices, games,
  trainings, coaching, or team/league
  sports groups are permitted.
- FIDO Field Dog Park is open 8 a.m. to noon daily.
- Disc golf course at B.T. Collins Park is open.

Parks and equipment users are asked to take personal responsibility for sanitizing sports equipment.

Masks or cloth face coverings are strongly advised when six-foot social distancing cannot be maintained.

Signage is prominently posted around parks to remind the public to comply with social distancing practices. City parks, trails, pavilions, and barbeques remain open so long as the public adheres to social distancing requirements.

#### **FOLSOM PUBLIC LIBRARY**

The Folsom Public Library began a phased reopening in June. Current hours are 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. Tuesdays through Saturdays, for a limited number of visitors to browse, check out books, and use computers. Each visitor will be able to use the library for no more than one hour at a time. Programming is not offered at this time, and children's computers are not available. Curbside library services will continue. To promote a safe environment, visitors are highly encouraged to wear face coverings at the library. For the safety of library patrons and staff, borrowed books and other materials will continue to be held for a minimum of three days after they are returned. ## Folsom City Council Adopts Balanced Budget

The Folsom City Council unanimously approved a balanced budget for the new fiscal year, which began July 1. The spending plan maintains high quality service levels and amenities for the Folsom community.

Some highlights of the spending plan include upgrades to the city's water treatment plant; street, sewer, and drainage improvements; Community Development permit center; and Light Rail station cameras in the Folsom Historic District.

#### SARATOGA WAY/WILSON BOULEVARD EXTENSION PROJECT COMPLETE

Traffic flow between El Dorado Hills and Folsom will significantly improve now that El Dorado County has completed the Saratoga Way/ Wilson Boulevard Extension Project. Saratoga Way travels a short distance westward from El Dorado Hills Boulevard, closely paralleling Highway 50 and connecting to Iron Point Road. Wilson Boulevard extends from the north intersecting with Saratoga Way. The Wilson Boulevard and the four-lane Saratoga Way extensions provide a direct connection via Iron Point Road in Folsom, and are more efficient venues to access destinations within Folsom.



#### GREEN VALLEY ROAD WIDENING UPDATE

Used by more than 25,000 motorists daily, Green Valley Road is an important connection between Folsom and El Dorado County. The Green Valley Road widening project is now complete, adding four travel lanes, buffered Class II bike lanes, a painted median/turn lane, and a parking area for the Mormon Island Wetlands State Park. The project will improve traffic flow, wait times at nearby traffic signals, and air quality by reducing commute times.



#### HOME REPAIR GRANTS FOR FOLSOM SENIOR CITIZENS

The City of Folsom assists qualified low-income senior citizens with minor health- and safety-related home repairs through its Seniors Helping Seniors Home Repair program, including electrical, plumbing, appliance, and heating/air conditioning repair projects. The program is not meant for cosmetic repairs or renovations.

To be eligible, applicants must be at least 65 years of age (55 years of age if a homeowner has a verifiable disability) and must earn less than 80 percent of the median income for Sacramento County. For more information, call 916-461-6210 or visit www.folsom.ca.us/seniorshelpingseniors.

#### Waste and Recycling Collections

The City of Folsom Solid Waste Division has seen a spike in the volume of trash and recycling during the stay-at-home orders. Help manage the extra waste by recycling what you can and keeping prohibited items out of the blue recycle bins.

### THE SOLID WASTE DIVISION OFFERS SIMPLE REMINDERS

- Single-use plastic bags cannot be recycled.
   Please reuse, place in your garbage can, or place in collection bins at your local grocery or home improvement store.
- Takeout food containers, including utensils, cups, paper plates, and napkins are not recyclable.
- Pizza boxes are not recyclable due to food residue. If the top of the pizza box is completely clean, it may be torn off and placed in the recycle bin.
- Recycle cardboard boxes (flattened and cut to about 12"x12" pieces). Larger boxes may be recycled at one of our community recycling drop-off locations.
- Tin, steel, and aluminum cans are recyclable; make sure the cans are clean and dry.

Wondering if an item is recyclable? Simply type an item in the Waste Wizard at www.folsom.ca.us/ wastecollection to find out if a material can be reused, recycled, composted, or placed in the garbage.

#### SPRUCE UP YOUR SPRINKLER SYSTEM AND SAVE

A little maintenance goes a long way toward making your home irrigation system use water more efficiently, saving you money on your utility bills. You can spruce up your irrigation system in four simple steps:

- Inspect. Check your system for clogged, broken, or missing sprinkler heads. Better yet, contact Folsom's Water Conservation Team and let one of our certified professionals perform a free Water-Wise House Call to check your system and identify problems, and provide you with helpful watering and landscape advice. Make an appointment by calling 916-461-6174 or visit waterconservation@folsom.ca.us.
- Connect. Examine points where the sprinkler heads connect to pipes or hoses. If water pools in your landscape or you have large wet areas, you could have a leak in your system. A leak as small as the tip of a ballpoint pen can waste about 6,300 gallons of water per month.
- Direct. Make sure to direct your sprinklers to apply water only to the landscape not the driveway, house, or sidewalk.
- Select. An improperly scheduled irrigation controller can waste a lot of water and money. Update your system's schedule with the seasons, or select a WaterSense labeled controller to take the guesswork out of scheduling.

# Fireworks Safety Tips

Fourth of July fireworks are a favorite Folsom tradition.
However, fireworks can quickly become dangerous if proper precautions are not taken. With a little care and common sense, fireworks can be a safe and fun activity for everyone. The Folsom Fire Department offers these important tips to stay safe this Fourth of July:

- Be sure to purchase "Safe and Sane" fireworks that bear the State Fire Marshal's seal.
- Fireworks that explode or leave the ground are illegal in California, unless if you have a fire department permit.
- Store fireworks in a cool, dry place.
- Read and follow all directions.
- When using legal fireworks, only set them off outdoors in a clear area that is away from homes, dry leaves, grass, and other flammable materials.

- Supervise children and be sure other people are out of range before lighting fireworks.
- Always have a bucket of water for disposal of fireworks and a hose connected to water in case of fire.
- Do not try to relight or handle malfunctioning fireworks. Soak them with water and throw them away.
- Fireworks are prohibited in all city-owned properties and parks except at the Lembi Community Park parking lot. The use of fireworks on all trails and open spaces in the City of Folsom is prohibited.




#### TRAIL SAFETY AND ETIQUETTE

Cyclists should keep to the right side of the trail, maintain a safe speed, and pass on the left side of oncoming pedestrians.
