FIREWORKS SAFETY TIPS

Fourth of July fireworks are a favorite Folsom tradition, but did you know more fires are reported on this day than on any other day of the year in the United States? Nearly half of these fires are caused by fireworks. The good news is you can enjoy the festivities and fireworks with just a few simple safety tips:

- Be sure to purchase "Safe and Sane" fireworks that bear the State Fire Marshal's seal. Fireworks that explode or leave the ground are illegal in California.
- Store fireworks in a cool, dry place.
- Read and follow all directions.
- When using legal fireworks, only set them off outdoors, in a clear area, away from homes, dry leaves, or grass and other flammable materials.
- Supervise children and be sure other people are out of range before lighting.
- Always have a bucket of water for disposal of fireworks and a hose connected to water in case of fire.
- Do not try to relight or handle malfunctioning fireworks. Soak them with water and throw them away.
- Know that use of fireworks on all bike trails and open spaces in the City is prohibited.
- All fireworks are prohibited in all City-owned properties and parks except at the Lembi Community Park parking lot.



Econome Family Park Grand Opening

The park is named to honor brothers George and Nick Econome and their respective wives, Marilyn and Ann, for their collective contributions to the Folsom community. Econome Park incorporates state-of-the-art park design features and environmental components. Recreational amenities include bocce ball courts, synthetic and natural turf soccer fields, tennis courts, and an open-play turf area. A half-mile perimeter walking path connects to two play areas and covered picnic areas, and provides access to The Parkway trail system. The park's environmental components include LED lighting for reduced energy use, vegetative swales to filter rain water and help replenish the aquifer, and reduced water-use landscaping. - Be cautious of currents and rocks under the water
- Only swim in designated areas
- Call 911 immediately if someone is in trouble or drowning

FOLSOM SENIOR CENTER PROGRAMS

The Folsom Senior Center provides a wide range of programs and services to the community. The Center is located at 48 Natoma Street and is open 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, and 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. on the second Saturday of each month. Anyone age 55 and older is welcome to visit; Folsom residency is not a requirement.

A rotating schedule of free activities take place in the Senior Lounge, and everyone is invited to join in, whether they're a "regular" or a new friend. Activities include games, movies, book discussions, bridge, and a popular "Off-Key Singers" group that meets Mondays and Fridays. The lounge maintains a stock of books, magazines, board games and puzzles for those who want to engage in some quiet activity.

The Folsom Senior Citizens Club welcomes new members to its meetings twice a month at the Center for lunch, games and occasional guest speakers. The Center also provides space for seniors and caregivers to meet with a variety of community support services and agencies. The Meals on Wheels program provides a hot lunch at 11:30 a.m. Monday through Friday for any senior age 60 or older. Seniors may also bring a brown-bag lunch and enjoy the mealtime companionship.

Folsom Parks & Recreation offers a variety of classes for seniors, including fine arts and ceramics; fitness classes including yoga, interval training, mobility and flexibility programs, and the popular Walk and Talk guided trail walks; driver's safety; and even free guitar lessons. Many of the senior classes are ongoing; some are fee-based and others are free. Free educational workshops are also offered throughout the year, focusing on topics including Social Security planning, healthcare management, caregiver assistance, identity theft prevention and more.

Free special events celebrating holidays, seasons and themes are hosted at the Senior Center throughout the year. The Independence Day Party takes place at 1:30 p.m. Friday, June 29; anyone age 55+ may attend and enjoy games, live entertainment and light refreshments.

WATER QUALITY REPORT AVAILABLE

The City of Folsom is known for its high water quality, which has helped attract major corporations to Folsom, including Gekkeikan-Sake and Kikkoman. As in years past, Folsom's tap water meets all State of California and U.S. Environmental Protection Agency drinking water health standards. The City makes every effort to safeguard its water supply and once again reports Folsom's system meets and exceeds every water quality standard.

The City of Folsom provides its customers with an annual water quality report, the Consumer Confidence Report, to demonstrate how Folsom's water meets and exceeds the state and federal drinking water standards. The City encourages community members to review this report as it provides details about the source and quality of the drinking water delivered to the community in 2017. SUMMER STORMWATER POLLUTION SOLUTIONS

Everyday summer activities such as gardening, home improvements and washing cars can negatively affect local creeks and streams. Help keep our waterways clean by following these tips on dealing with common around-the-house pollutants this summer:

FERTILIZERS AND PESTICIDES

- Use pesticides and fertilizers sparingly, and do not apply two days before a forecasted rainfall.
- Cover piles of dirt and mulch to prevent pollutants from blowing into gutters and storm drains.
- Sweep debris from sidewalks and patios.
- Use non-toxic alternatives for pests.

HOUSEHOLD CHEMICALS

- Rinse paintbrushes in the sink, not in the gutter. Avoid using paint thinner for cleaning, and use disposable brushes instead.
- Clean up outdoor spills with a broom, not a hose. Use absorbents such as cat litter or sawdust.
- Buy non-toxic products whenever possible.

VEHICLE MAINTENANCE

- Regularly check your vehicles for leaks and repair them. Use cat litter to clean up auto leaks or spills.
- Dispose of motor oil, antifreeze and other fluids at an auto center or gas station that recycles, or participate in the City of Folsom's curbside motor oil pick-up program.
