


NOW HIRING FOR SUMMER JOBS

Bring Your Ideas to Life with 3D Printing

3D printing — the process of making three-dimensional solid objects from digital designs — is an emerging technology that will be central to advances in fields such as manufacturing, medicine, and space colonization.

Learn more about this expanding field at a presentation hosted by the Folsom Public Library on Saturday, February 18 from 2 to 3:30 p.m. Learn from industry veteran Jeramie Ivie about the 3D printing industry, new technologies and futuristic applications that are making headlines.

The Folsom Public Library is home to a 3D printing lab, and the Lab's six 3D printers are available every Sunday from noon to 4 p.m. In the first year of operation, more than 700 people have visited the Lab — printing everything from household objects to homework assignments. The Lab was made possible by grant funding from the Intel Foundation. Thanks to many public donations of the plastic filament needed to print 3D objects, printing remains free to the public. Plastic filament donations are always welcome.

NEW CALIFORNIA CAR SEAT LAW TAKES EFFECT

As of January 1, children under the age of 2 years must be in a rear-facing car seat, unless the child weighs 40 pounds or more, or is 40 inches or taller. California law continues to require that all children under the age of 8 years be properly restrained in an appropriate child safety seat in the back seat of a vehicle.

Change Your Clock, Change Your Battery

Two-thirds of home fire deaths result from fires in homes without a working smoking alarm, according to the National Fire Protection Agency. Folsom firefighters remind you to change the batteries in your smoke alarms when you move your clocks forward on Sunday, March 12.

There should be one smoke alarm in every bedroom, along with an alarm outside each sleeping area, on each story of the home. Newly installed smoke detectors must be California Fire Marshal approved (look for a label on the box.)

A carbon monoxide alarm should be installed on each floor of the residence, outside of each separate sleeping area. As well as changing the batteries twice a year it is also important to check smoke and carbon monoxide alarms monthly by pressing the test button. Replace the entire alarm if it's more than 10 years old or doesn't work properly when tested.
