Folsom City Council Adopts \$194 Million Balanced Budget

The Folsom City Council unanimously approved a \$194 million balanced budget for the 2016-2017 fiscal year. The spending plan preserves the unique Folsom experience, maintains the quality of core services, invests in the future, sustains a clear and strong financial plan and bolsters reserves.

The budget reflects increases in the City's major revenue sources, a steady improvement in the economy and marks the fifth consecutive year of adding to a rainy day fund, a key to the City's long-term financial sustainability.

The budget includes a capital improvement program for the upcoming fiscal year, which will fund public infrastructure in the City, including the widening of Green Valley Road between East Natoma Street and the El Dorado County line, Rainbow and Orangevale bridge rehabilitation projects, street resurfacing projects and water and sewer infrastructure upgrades.

Nearly half of the City's budget invests in public safety, including police and fire services. The budget includes the hiring of two police officers and a records clerk, allowing the Folsom Police Department to restore service at the public counter to five days a week.

Parks and Recreation projects include the construction of Econome Family Park, Johnny Cash Trail Phase II and a disc golf course at Nisenan Park. The Folsom Public Library will receive an additional \$30,000 in funding for books, technology and other materials.

Fireworks Safety Tips

Fourth of July fireworks are a favorite Folsom tradition, but did you know that more fires are reported on this day than on any other day of the year in the United States? Nearly half of these fires are caused by fireworks. The good news is you can enjoy the festivities and fireworks with just a few simple safety tips:

- Be sure to purchase "Safe and Sane" fireworks that bear the State Fire Marshal's seal. If fireworks explode or leave the ground, it is illegal in California.
- Store fireworks in a cool, dry place.
- Read and follow all directions.
- When using legal fireworks, only set them off outdoors, in a clear area, away from homes, dry leaves, or grass and other flammable materials.

- Supervise children and be sure other people are out of range before lighting.
- Always have a bucket of water for disposal of fireworks, and a hose connected to water in case of fire.
- Do not try to relight or handle malfunctioning fireworks. Soak them with water and throw them away.
- Know that use of fireworks on all bike trails and open spaces in the city is prohibited.
- Use of fireworks in the city's parks is discouraged and regulated by city ordinance #1052.
