The City of Folsom Communication Office regularly and proactively provides timely and relevant news and information to residents, businesses, prospective job creators, community organizations, and the media.

COMMUNITY SERVICE DAY

More than 2,500 volunteers completed over 100 service projects throughout Folsom at the 8th annual Community Service Day on September 18. The event resulted in approximately 80,000 pounds of food for the Twin Lakes Food Bank—that's 25,000+ pounds more than previous years!

- More than 50 seniors received help with home projects.
- Donation Drive organizers collected 67 bikes, 138 purses, ten boxes of LEGOs, 141 letters for the military, and four large boxes of Christmas gifts.
- Volunteers donated 33 pints of blood at the Blood Drive.
- \$90,000+ in cash and in-kind sponsorships raised.









■ OPEN SPACE CLOSURES IN FOLSOM DUE TO EXTREME FIRE RISK

Designated city-owned open spaces that have high fire risk potential are now off-limits in Folsom. The City of Folsom issued an emergency order on August 9 in response to extreme fire danger and extraordinary drought conditions.

WATER CONSERVATION CAMPAIGN



A Stage 3 water conservation declaration went into effect on August 30. Folsom residents are now required to reduce water use by 20% to protect the city's water supply. A citywide public information program informed the community about the watering requirements and how to conserve.

BY DISTRICT ELECTIONS PUBLIC INFORMATION PROGRAM

At its July 27 meeting, the Folsom City Council approved a resolution declaring its intent to transition to a by-district system for electing Folsom City Councilmembers. Public hearings began Tuesday, September 14 and will continue through February 2022.

SOLID WASTE UTILITY RATE STUDY AND ISSUANCE OF PROPOSITION 218 NOTICE

The City of Folsom is proposing solid waste rate increases. New state-mandated programs under SB 1383 will increase costs—including weekly food waste collection from residents and businesses. A public information campaign is underway to inform property owners and the customer of record about the proposed rates.

NEW AND IMPROVED ONLINE BILL PAYMENT SERVICE

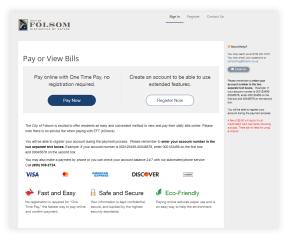
In July, the City of Folsom launched a new user-friendly online payment system for its utilities customers.

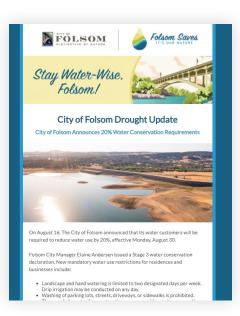
